**September, the Transition Begins!**

Happy September everyone! I hope everyone had a great summer and that you didn't get too hot! September is a month that begins a lot of things. For us at the Tacoma Buddhist Temple, we begin Dharma School, and I am certain the same students begin their school year as well! That means back to classrooms, homework, and extracurricular activities! We also begin to enter into the season of fall or autumn!

I am certain that most of you reading this are ready to take a break from the heat! Or maybe not! Maybe some of you love the summertime weather! Either way, the season continues to change, and the days will become shorter whether we like it or not! I certainly hope everyone enjoys their September! Students, study hard, and deeply listen to your teachers! Their lessons and experience are invaluable! Ganbatte! For all of us, please continue to recite the Nembutsu!

Vacuum all carpets including stairwells


**Rev. Pratt Room:** Vacuum carpet
